How to revise	Tips to answer common/extended questions

FOR EACH UNIT DIVIDE THE REVISION IN TO 3 CATEGORIES: CRIME, PUNISHMENT AND LAW ENFORCEMENT.</p> <p>WHITECHAPEL: REVISE FEATURES OF POLICING, WORKHOUSES, LIVING ACCOMODATIONS AND WORK. Nazi Germany). Use the revision tools available by the school and have a go at practice papers and creating inferences from sources. Again, use the revision cards provided by school or Edexcel to recap and revisit areas you are uncertain of.

Cold War – LEARN THE STRUCTURES! Go through the structure sheets before even beginning revision. When revising look for the key items; WHAT did events lead to (e.g., tension, distrust, anger, new laws, military alliances, Arms Race), WHO was angry and WHY. Why is each event significant and what are the results (consequences).

Elizabethan England: Key topics looking at the problems Elizabeth faced. As this exam is a feature, 12-mark essay and 16 mark essay, look at the bigger picture. Causes, consequences factors, problems as these will make up the theme of the essay questions.
