


Headteacher's Update

Safety and Wellbeing

After half-term we will be joined by the Youth Prevention Team for sessions on preventing knife crime across the city. The team are visiting all schools and have an engagement van which allows young people to hear more about the issue of knife crime and what steps they can take to prevent it. We frequently hear stories in the media about the rise in young people carrying knives and so it is crucial that schools continue to play their part in reducing knife crime through high quality education. The Police frequently brief schools and have made it clear that any young person carrying a knife in Brighton will receive a caution.

We would also like to draw your attention to the issue of 'training knives' (example pictured below) which are freely available online. These training knives are treated as offensive weapons and should never be carried in public or brought into school.




Chestnut Tree Hospice


Year 7 Parents' Evening

Nirvana Day

Nirvana Day is an annual Buddhist festival that remembers the death of the Buddha when he reached Nirvana at the age of 80.

Nirvana is believed to be the end of the cycle of death and rebirth. Buddhism teaches that Nirvana is reached when all want and suffering is gone. Most Buddhists celebrate Nirvana Day on the 15 February. Others celebrate it on 8 February. It is also known as Parinirvana Day.

Buddhists may celebrate Nirvana Day by meditating or by going to Buddhist temples or monasteries. In monasteries, Nirvana Day is treated as a social occasion. Food is prepared and some people bring presents such as money, household goods or clothes.

On Nirvana Day, Buddhists think about their lives and how they can gain the perfect peace of Nirvana. They

remember friends or relations who have recently died. They reflect on the fact that death is a part of life for everyone.

The idea that nothing stays the same is important to Buddhism. Buddhists believe that loss and change are things to be accepted rather than causes of sadness.
