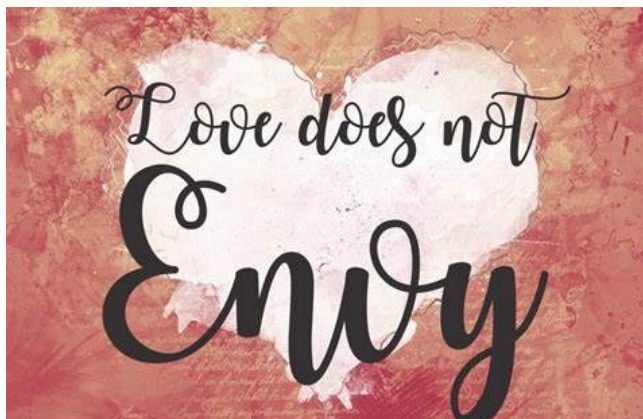




Headteacher's Update

Juliette Parkin is a presenter and reporter on BBC South East Today television news. She has been a BBC journalist for 22 years working in radio and television news and spent 4 years as a sports journalist. She has hosted women's football events and worked as a guest lecturer with journalism undergraduates at the University of Brighton. Juliette is also a mum of two and long distance runner and competes for Great Britain in aquathlon - that's swim/run events.



Daniel Harnden works for the London Fire Brigade in their Sutton office. Last year his team won the LFBs people award for bravery and outstanding actions across the whole of London.



Jude Tyrrell was a Founding student at King's. He left Kings in June 2018. He studied Maths, Further Maths, Physics and Computer Science at A-level.

He has just completed his Computer Science degree at Homerton College, Cambridge.



Mark Campbell is from Belfast and originally trained as an architect at Edinburgh University before working overseas as an international aid worker in countries such as Uganda, DR Congo and Afghanistan. Girls football Monday 13th November

On Monday 13th November we took the Year 7 girls football team and the Year 8 girls football team over to Dorothy Stringer for their league matches. Both teams played 9-a-side games and shared 3 Year 7 substitutes between them. One player, Saffron M even played for both the Year 7 and the Year 8 teams.

The Year 8s faced a well drilled side who loved to attack, our girls faced a persistent barrage of attack throughout the whole fixture. However, they did manage to find some time, space and energy to mount their own attacks and place pressure on the Stringer defence.

King's went into the half-time break 3-2 down after applying so much pressure that Stringer were forced into conceding two own goals. Despite a hard fought effort King's couldn't pull back the deficit and in the end succumbed under the intense pressure to concede 4 more goals, the match finishing 7-2 to Stringer.

The Year 7 side were also very strong and well drilled, they too were relentless in attack. Despite some outstanding saves from Erin H in goal and brilliant attacking play through the midfield we found ourselves 2-1 down at half-time, Gabby R grabbing our only goal of the half to keep us in the game. During the second half the teams appear more evenly matched as our defence improved their link play with the midfield and communicated better. Despite conceding 3 goals in this half, we also scored a couple, including a masterful corner from Nell M that curved beautifully to go in. Gabby R scored the other goal. Unfortunately, a 5-3 loss this time but this is a new team with plenty of talent and opportunity to find the right fit for them.

I am proud of both teams, the leadership, support and understanding they have and showed each other through their matches was astounding, neither team gave up battling during their games. There is more to come from both of these teams.

Year 10 Football—Cup Round 2

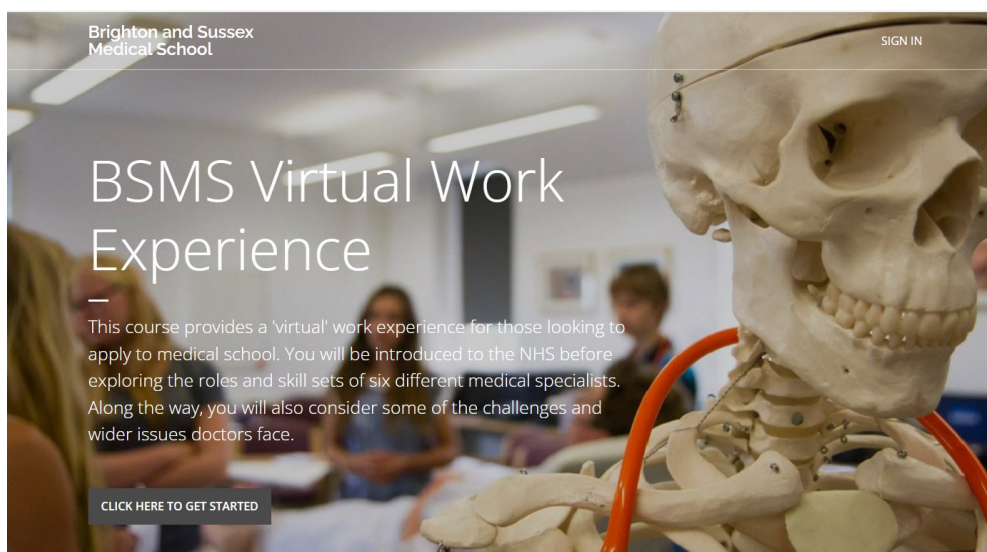
