Dear Parent/Carer,

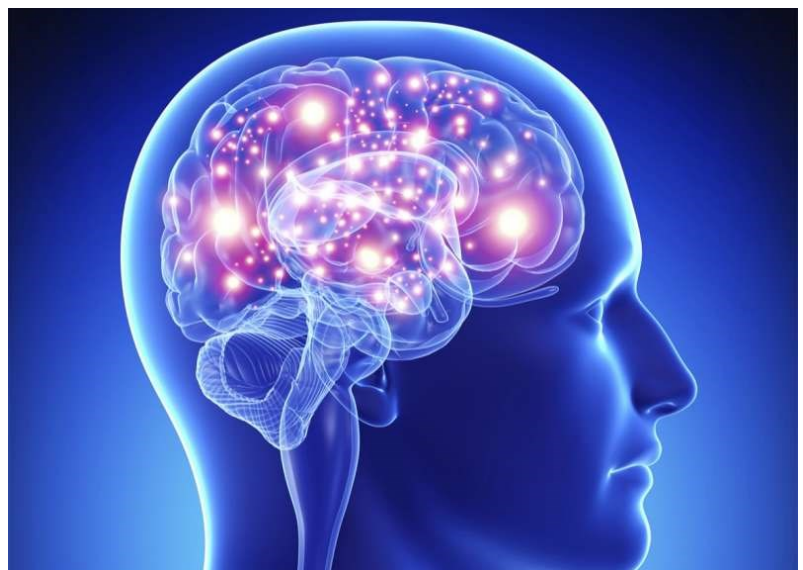

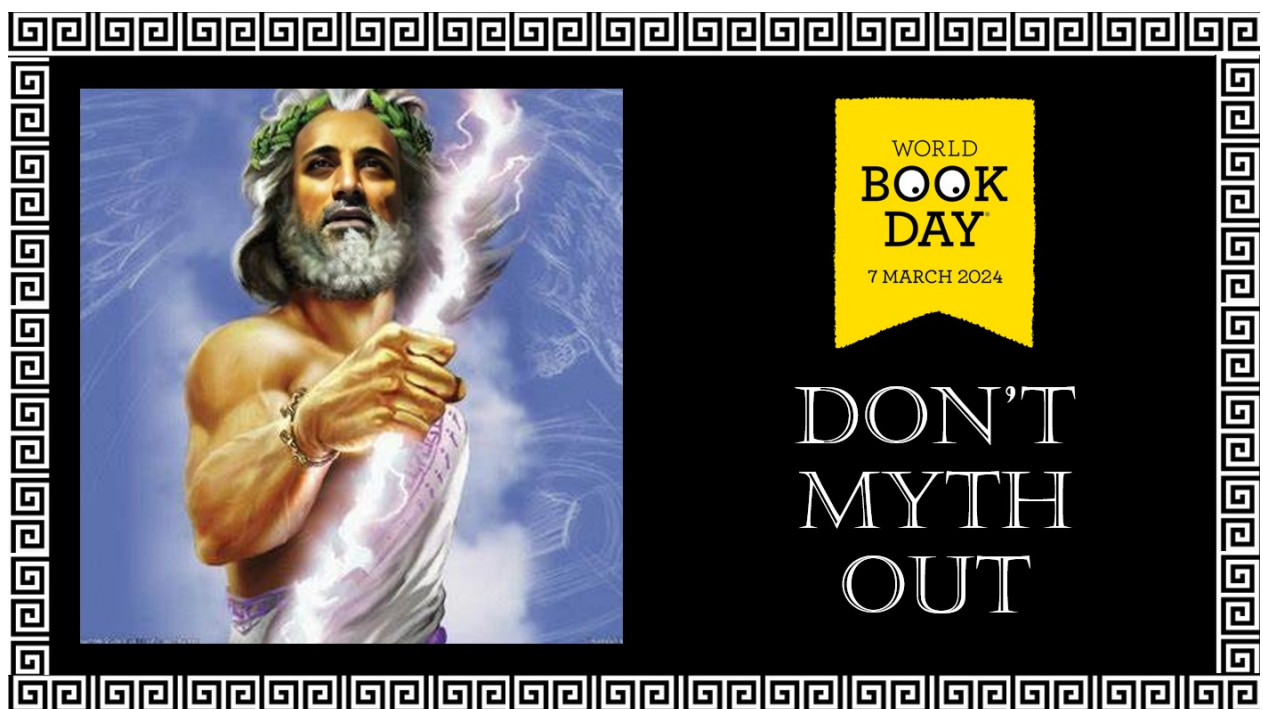

Make Your Mark Consultation

This year's Make Your Mark consultation is now underway. Make Your Mark is the largest consultation of 11 - 18-year-olds in Europe. It gives young people the chance to have their say on what matters to them. From the results of the 2022 consultation, the National Campaign 'Food for Learning' was developed. This focussed on food poverty across the UK, aiming to ensure every child in the UK can access a good quality, healthy, hot free school meal. From the results locally, a Health and Wellbeing Campaign was established. Work on this is coming to an end and will conclude with a Young People's Mental Health Summit in Spring next year. This year young people will be asked to select their priority issues from 10 categories.

Netball

On Wednesday 28th February, our Year 7, 9 and 10 netball teams played Dorothy Stringer. All three squads had tight games with multiple students playing slightly out of position. Year 7's lost 9-8, with both schools drawing for the majority of the game. Year 9's lost 7-6, with Stringer winning in the last 30 seconds of the game. The Year 11 team lost 11-8, despite a really difficult first half of the game. Despite three losses, all three games were matched for possession and there was some outstanding play demonstrated.

Riley C played out of position for the duration of the year 9 game - not that this was noticeable at all. She was able to confidently bring the ball through court and restrict the amount of Stringer attacking position. Ella G was absolutely outstanding for the Year 7 team, demonstrating fantastic discipline and control throughout the game. Her enthusiasm as captain on the day was what the team needed in such terrible weather conditions.

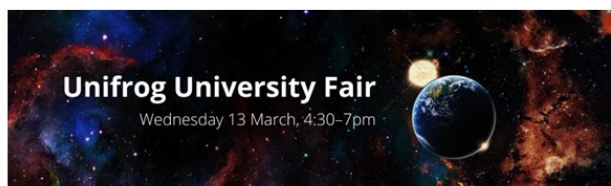
