Enrichment

On Friday 28th March we will be holding our second enrichment day of the year.

- The two sides of the year in year 7 will be swapping activities from December so that all students have the opportunity to visit Herstmonceux Observatory and to see the Globe Players Theatre group.
- Year 8 will be having an immersive History experience when Frontline Living History will be in school to deliver workshops about the experiences of soldiers during the first world war.
- Year 9 are taking part in three different events. Firstly, the Year group are off to Ypres in Belgium to visit the WW1 battlefields. The students back in school will be having one of two local experiences; they will either be visiting the AMEX stadium and Stanmer Park or will be exploring Benfield Valley Nature Reserve.
- Year 10 will be taking part in a cultural day. They will be raising money for Compassion UK who will be in school to explain their work to the year group. In addition, they will play a range of sports from around the world to gain an understanding of different cultures. Art students will be out of school on this day as they head off to London to visit the Tate modern.
- Year 11 students will be in school where they will have specialist Religion and Philosophy lessons and as well as working on their option subjects.

Year 10 Exams and How you can support them

Year 10 End of Year exams will be held at the end of April (not the end of the year - confusingly!) They will last for 1 week between Monday 28th April and Friday 2nd May. The reason they happen at that point is two-fold:

- 1. This gives us some time in year 10 once we have marked these to start intervention groups. When we did these exams in July, following the GCSEs and A Levels, we often found it was too late to do anything useful with the information they gave us.
- 2. The actual GCSE exams start the following week so we cannot do them any later without moving them to July.

These exams are extremely useful as they give students their first experience of completing exams in the exam rooms and to exam conditions. They also give teachers valuable information that helps them diagnose problems, adjust their own teaching and target specific students for extra support.

We don't call these exams "mock exams" as they don't do all the exam papers that make up a full exam series. The exam papers will be real and will be marked by the mark scheme. The grades they get will not necessarily mirror their final grades, however, they do give teachers a good indication of how well students are progressing in their subject.

All year 10 have been learning in their PSHE lessons about preparing for exams. The best ways parents can support are:

- Talking to students about the exams coming up (in 7 weeks).
- Checking whether they have made a revision timetable Easter will be an important time to make sure that they are revising on most days and have a good plan. I don't recommend a specific one there are lots online. I did a quick internet search and found one that can be downloaded for free here Revision Timetable Template Free Printable PDF (The timetable looks good I have not looked at the links or any of the advice they give so cannot vouch for them).
- Checking they have revision resources for all their subjects.
